however, with bad luck we catch a cold and rainy day, with extensive rainfall, so please be prepared to bring rain protection a light jumper and of course sturdy shoes for the

forest site visit where we will take few short walks into the stands.

<u>Cost:</u> Approx. 60 €including transport, lunch and dinner. The final amount will be

communicated when the trip is finally fixed and the number of participants is known.

The fee will be collected <u>cash</u> at the conference registration desk.





Description

This excursion will take you into the dense Southern part of the Black Forest, which is part of the Natural Park "Südschwarzwald". This region hosts one of the most outstanding forest districts called "Todtmoos", where close to nature forestry has a long tradition and has led to impressive forest sites.

Specific requirements for competences of the whole team in management and operations in close to nature forestry in mixed stands will be illustrated. The capacities for teamwork of the regional forester, the forestry workers, and the local contractors maintain highest ecological values and gain maximum economic benefit from timber utilisation.

After a nourishing lunch in a typical restaurant we will take a stop over for a visit of the Dome of St. Blasien, which is a true cultural highlight in this region.

The afternoon will be dedicated to the presentation of some outstanding nature protection projects in the Nature Park "Südschwarzwald". Here a specific focus will be on the further education of foresters who are involved in interdisciplinary ecological project. Among others mooreland renaturation and habitat management in forests will be demonstrated on selected scenic sites.

The tour will end at a farm restaurant where simple but delicious regional products will be offered. Return to Freiburg will be at approx. 20:00 hrs. Earlier return to the city might be arranged on demand.
